water safety, first aid and CPR. Children are assigned to counselors who provide leadership and guidance to each camper in their care. A capable leadership team comprised of a camp director, pastoral care provider and a mentor supervises the staff of camp counselors.

Camp Activities

Teamwork and conflict resolution skills are emphasized during our camp activities. Activities include exploring the woodlands through nature hikes, arts and crafts, scavenger hunts, kayaking, swimming and evenings gathered around the campfire. Time is also set aside for devotionals and Bible study each day. Other activities include a high and low ropes course, rock wall climbing, organized group games, an outdoor movie night, cookouts, and much more!

Our Hope

Our hope is that each child will grow in their appreciation of the beautiful world God has entrusted to us, and learn and understand that each of us is a child of God regardless of our differences. Through interaction with their peers and counselors we hope the children will experience the joy of working as a team to see that they can make the world a better place in which to live.

Camp Facilities

The Camp Fraser Lodge, with a capacity of 100, is ideal for group gatherings. A well-equipped commercial kitchen is located on the main level adjacent to the large meeting room where groups may gather for meals and meetings. Rest rooms and shower facilities are located on the lower level near the dorm rooms.

Summer campers enjoy sleeping in one of the six rustic cabins scattered under the trees adjacent to the lodge. These cabins are screened and have double bunk beds suitable for children. Each cabin sleeps eight campers including their counselor. The caretaker's house is within view of all cabins.



Transportation and Camp Fees

A fee of \$150 per summer session covers transportation between Calvary Baptist Church and Camp Fraser, meals prepared by our resident cook, snacks, craft materials and other camp activities. Transportation details will be provided to registered campers. Scholarships are available for those needing assistance.
